1960s

- '65 The Council on Public Higher Education approve Eastern's law enforcement programs
- '66 Eastern Kentucky State College becomes Eastern Kentucky University

First law enforcement class held at Eastern

Department of Law Enforcement becomes School of Law Enforcement, Robert Posey is named Director

EKU creates Traffic Safety Institute

Kentucky Peace Officer's Standards and Training Council established
- '68 Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act
- '69 School of Law Enforcement graduate program established

1970s

- '72 Associate Degree in Industrial Security offered
- '73 Law Enforcement Assistance Administration names EKU Center of Excellence
- '74 School of Law Enforcement becomes College of Law Enforcement

Robert Posey named Dean
- '75 Stratton Building Opens

Dedication of Henry D. Stratton Building, Robert W. Posey Auditorium, Robert C. Stone Fitness Center and Leslie H. Leach Driving Range

Two and four year degrees created for: Fire Prevention and Control program; Department of Correctional Services; and Department of Police Administration

1980s

- '83 Truett Ricks named Dean
- '84 Departments of Fire Prevention and Control, Security and Traffic Safety Institute combined to form Department of Loss Prevention and Safety

Training Resource Center (TRC) established
- '85 Bureau of Training becomes Department of Criminal Justice Training
- '86 Department of Police Administration begins Air Force graduate program

Department of Police Administration becomes Department of Police Studies
- '88 National Juvenile Detention Association locates office at EKU

1990s

- '93 Funderburk Building opens
- '95 Ashland Fire Safety Laboratory opens
- '96 Insurance and Risk Management Program moves to College of Law Enforcement

Department of Correctional Services adds the Center for Criminal Justice Education & Research
- '97 Gary Cordner named Dean
- '98 College of Law Enforcement recognized as Program of Distinction

Department of Correctional Services becomes the Department of Correctional and Juvenile Justice Studies
- '99 Kentucky Center for School Safety comes to EKU

2000s
